




Euribor rates

International three-month interest rates





Yield on ten-year Finnish government bonds and differential vs Germany




Euro area (Finland's) yield curve










Deposits of euro area residents with Finnish MFIsDeposits of euro area residents with euro area MFIs



Euro area and Finnish MFIs: growth of loans


Loans by Finnish MFIs to euro area residentsLoans by euro area MFIs to euro area residests

Liabilities of Finnish monetary financial institutions



Selected stock price indices in the euro area









Total market capitalization (left-hand scale)

Listed shares in Finland: total market capitalization and non-residents' holdings



Finnish bonds and money market paper, net purchases



Bonds issued in Finland




Mutual funds registered in Finland









—Central government





Euro exchange rates against the pound sterling and the Swedish krona



Finland's narrow competitiveness indicatorEuro's effective exchange rate







Industrial production



Industrial confidence indicator



Manufacturing production by sector in Finland



Finland's imports of goods




Consumer confidence



 - Spare capacity (right-hand scale)




Finland's exports of goods





- Bank of Finland forecast, summer 2004



Harmonized index of consumer prices (HICP)




Producer prices








Employment in Finland





Public sector debt in Finland



Finland's goods account and current account


12-month moving totals
