



Deposit rate (excess reserve rate until end-1998)


Main refinancing rate / minimum bid rate (tender rate until end-1998)


Euribor rates

International three-month interest rates





Yield on ten-year Finnish government bonds and differential vs. Germany




Euro area (Finland's) yield curve





Interest rates on new loans to households







Deposits of euro area residents with Finnish MFIsDeposits of euro area residents with euro area MFIs



Loans by euro area MFIs to euro area residence



Liabilities of Finnish monetary financial institutions included in monetary aggregates for the euro area *




Outstanding loans to households and non-financial corporations




Selected stock price indices in the euro area

Non-residents' holdings as % of market capitalization (right-hand scale)



Finnish bonds and money market paper, net purchases



Bonds issued in Finland




Mutual funds registered in Finland







—Central government



Euro exchange rates against the pound sterling and the Swedish krona




Euro's external value and Finland's competitiveness indicator Finland's narrow competitiveness indicator


Euro's effective exchange rate

Competitiveness indicators for Finland



Gross domestic product in Finland



Industrial production



Industrial confidence indicator



Manufacturing production by sector



Finland's imports of goods








- Spare capacity (right-hand scale)




Finland's exports of goods



Finland's exports by industry





Harmonized index of consumer prices (HICP)



Inflation rates in the euro area (HICP)










- General government net lending

12-month moving totals



-NIIP excl. nonresidents' holdings of listed Finnish shares


